WOC Fall Striper Derby, October 22nd, 2022 Rules

Time: 5:30 am Launch (safe light) measured length deadline at 2 pm sharp;

- Entrants <u>must</u> register at ramp area prior to fishing; donuts and coffee available; BBQ lunch will be served beginning at 12. am until 2:30 pm; awards presentation will be held immediately after.
- At sign in: you must declare (on the sign in form) whether you are a WOC member or other.
- Stay to the left inside the gate and get your boat ready for launching quickly please. There will be lots of helpers and a shuttle from the upper parking area.
- Fish must be taken by Fish & Wildlife regulations.
- Only ONE FISH PER PERSON will be measured in.
- In the case of a tie, the winning fish will be determined by weight of the fish. if both fish measure the same and weigh the same, the winner will be determined by drawing straws.
- Fish can be presented for measurement any time prior to 2 pm.
- Only certified entries qualify to win and receive trophies, prizes, points, etc.
- Derby is open to WOC members and family or friends as long as the boat owner is a member.
- Awards: There will be trophies for First Place, Second Place, and Third Place. (Trophies provided courtesy of Rick Tietz, *Blade Runner Tackle*).
- Additional prizes for the top 10 winners.
- The top ten WOC member finishers will accumulate "points" towards the determination of the *Angler Of The Year* award winner; to wit, <u>only valid, dues paying members of WOC shall accumulate derby</u> <u>points</u> towards the determination of the Angler Of The Year Award.
- WOC guest anglers qualify to win individual awards/prizes but DO NOT accumulate points towards Angler Of The Year.
- Angler Of The Year winner will be determined by the WOC member holding the most accumulated derby "points" combining BOTH the Fall derbies. In the case of a tie on points, the Angler Of The Year winner will be determined by the greatest total (combined) weight of the person's two fish registered at the two derbies.
- Ceremonial presentation of Angler Of The Year winner's jacket will be done at Angler Of The Year Awards Dinner on a later date.

All fish entered must be taken in the Port/Barge Canal/Lake Washington/or in the Deep-Water Channel not South of Marker # 54

Ramp Repair Update by Guy Brown, former Commodore, Ramp Repair Committee Chair (916-849-3490, gbrownsac@sbcglobal.net).

We've removed the old structure (I-beam, 6' cattle guard and 6' beaver tail).

We have poured two 3' square by 4' deep cement footings with metal fittings into the existing cement ramp to anchor two 50-foot long 8-inch I-beams. Each of these consists of four sections cut into different lengths and weld angles to conform to the slope of our cement ramp. These will reach 15' beyond the end of the existing cement ramp. This structure will be 5-foot longer than our previous usable ramp, providing 14 foot more usable trailer reach length.

We've attached a 2-inch round "rub rail" inside the I-beams to cushion trailers running into it.

We've welded a trailer "tire-trap" at the end of the ramp to "catch" the tire with a noticeable "drop", warning the driver to go no further.

Final welding was completed this week. Priming and painting will be completed by the end of this week.

Thompson Welding is scheduling the trailer to deliver the materials to the ramp and the use of a 26,500-pound load capacity Reach-Lift to maneuver the I-beams into place.

All materials should be delivered to the ramp and installed within the next two to three weeks

It will take about three days to secure the I-beams, attach 5 sections of 15 foot-wide heavy, galvanized grating panels between the I-beams.

We have asked The Port District/West Sac if they will contribute to the project's cost. They have agreed to contribute \$15,000.

At this point total Club project cost is expected to be around \$140,000 (less The Port District/West Sac \$15,000), well within our budget, leaving us in a positive cash balance at the end of the year.

We have already entered into discussions with The Port District/West Sac regarding a long-term license. Upon completion of the ramp repair, we will submit an invoice to them for the \$15,000 and finalize a new license.

We have accomplished all of the planning for the repair with a group of Club member volunteers serving on a Ramp Committee. They persisted through all of the design challenges, difficulty obtaining qualified welders and all of the COVID, supply-chain challenges of the past two plus years. It has taken a lot of time and effort of a small, dedicated group of members to get to where we are.

After the repair the ramp that you see above water will look the same. We were not able to correct the "rocky road to Dublin" nature of our existing cement ramp sections without having to conduct environmental studies required by The Port District/West Sac, State and Federal regulators. These would have involved up to two years to complete and up to \$70,000 in additional project cost. The "repaired" part of the ramp is below the water where the corroded grating was and where the new grating extends further into the water.

At this time, it appears the ramp will reopen the end of this month or in early **October.** We will send out an email as soon as we know of the date reopening.
