I just wanted to share a few things with the Membership to let you know some of the plans we have for the upcoming year. In addition, to completing the repairs to the ramp the Board is working on the following:

- 1. TEXTING SERVICE -The Board will be checking into companies that can set up a "texting" service. This service will allow us to "text" all members on upcoming events or activities. Emails and membership meetings are a good way to send out info and this is just another more reliable way to ensure that members are up to date. Members can opt out to receiving these texts. We just delete the phone number from out Master list. Members can send back responses but only to the originator (WOC). This service can cost from \$25.00 to \$45.00 a month depending on the number of texts that go out to the Membership.
- 2. **FACEBOOK PAGE** We have developed a Washington Outboard Club Facebook Page for members who are interested. Members are encouraged to participate and share their own pictures and fishing experiences.
- 3. **KEY CARD VS. KEY ENTRY** -The Board is exploring the use of a key card entry to the main gate versus the key lock. As time has gone by many ex-members have not returned their gate key. About 95% of members who do not re-enroll keep their key. A key card entry system would allow the Club to delete former members' key designation from a Master list preventing them from gaining access to the Port. Additionally, replacement keys currently cost \$20.00 and a replacement key card would be less than \$5.00. This is in the early planning stages as we would have to work with all the other Port User Groups (PUG) to use this system.
- 4. **COMMUNITY SERVICE** The Board is in the early stages of expanding our community services, particularly to the West Sacramento area. The WOC is dependent upon the City of West Sacramento to allow us to use the Port. Our hope is to work with community organizations to solidify our relationship with the City of West Sacramento. Clean-up crews, taking a child fishing, and neighborhood repairs are being considered.

5. **MORE SOCIAL STUFF** – The WOC is designated as a "social club" and the Board would like to develop more activities that give the members an opportunity to interact with each other. We will be scheduling at least one family picnic and one fish swap for the Spring/Summer time.
